Executive Summary on the Department

The department of Dermatology and Venereology of Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) has been functioning from the inception of Chittagong Medical College and Hospital since 1960.

Bangladesh is a developing country and here is wide prevalence of Skin and Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) in this part of the country. In this regard, the department is fully active in both patient management with Out-patient department (OPD) and 32 (17+15) bedded In-patient department (IPD) facilities and academic activities like teaching and research.

The CMCH is the oldest tertiary care hospital in this region. Patients of this region with different kinds of skin diseases and STDs including HIV/AIDS attend this hospital for proper treatment. The department is fully engaged to train skill manpower in the field of dermatology and Venereology in both undergraduate and post graduate levels. Currently, we are conducting MBBS, MD and Post-graduate Diploma (DDV) courses in this department under Chittagong Medical University, Chittagong University and Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University, Dhaka. The department is also affiliated for the training of FCPS and MCPS under the auspices of Bangladesh College of Physicians and Surgeons.

We have a vision to nurture world-class professionals, practicing dermatologist, academicians, researchers, innovators who would be ready to tackle local and international dermatological development needs to the twenty-first century. Our aim is to improve the care of patients with skin and sexually transmitted disease who do not have access to specialist skills and with a commitment to make valuable contribution to health and society. 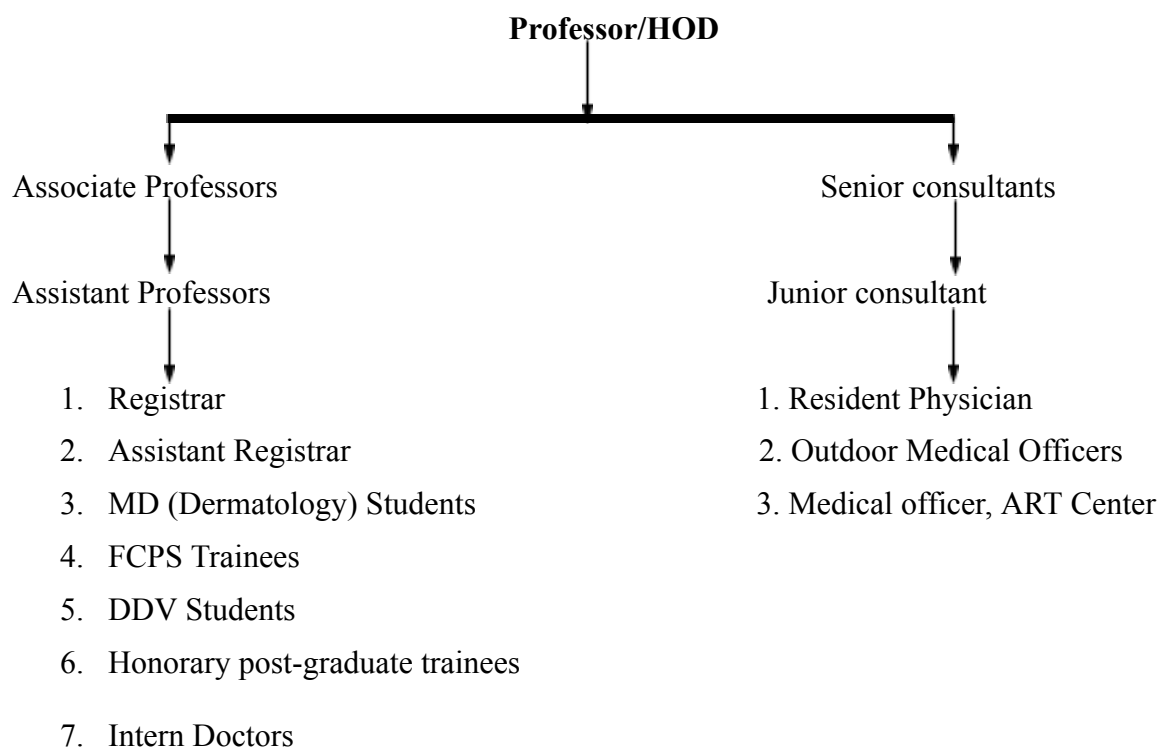
The objectives of the department are as follows
